

# THE BATTLE OF OUDENARDE, 1708

## ALLIED ORDER OF BATTLE

**SCALE: 85 ACTUAL BATTALIONS TO 45; 150 ACTUAL SQUADRONS TO 71.**

### **Prince Eugene of Savoy — Right (18 squadrons, 17 battalions, 1 battery)**

Lumley. 18 Squadrons deployed on the far right:

Kellum: 6 squadrons English Horse

Stairs: 6 squadrons English and Scots Dragoons

Syburg: 6 squadrons Hanoverian & Hessian Dragoons

Cadogan. 8 battalions deployed to the north of Eyne and Heurne:

Temple: 2 battalions English foot guards & 1 light gun battery

Sabine: 2 battalions English.

Plettenberg: 2 battalions Prussians.

Gauvin: 2 battalions Dutch and Germans.

Argyle. 9 battalions advancing in 2 columns to the left of Cadogan.

Primrose: 2 battalions English.

Eltz: 3 battalions Hanoverians.

Keppell: 2 battalions Hessians.

Bernard: 2 battalions Hessians.

### **John Churchill, Duke of Marlborough — Centre (42 squadrons, 10 battalions)**

Lottum. 10 battalions advancing in 2 columns to plug the gap between Schaerken and Diepenbeek.

Ranck: 2 battalions Dutch & 1 light gun battery

Collyear: 2 battalions Scots in Dutch service

Burck: 2 battalions Prussians

Wertmüller: 2 battalions Germans,

Hufell: 2 battalions Germans

Natzmer: 20 squadrons Prussian horse (10 remaining after the first game).

Rantzau: 8 squadrons Hanoverian horse (6 remaining after the first game).

Pentz: 14 squadrons German dragoons advancing in 2 columns behind Lottum with orders to support Natzmer.

### **Heer van Nassau-Ouwerkerk — Left (12 squadrons, 18 battalions, 2 batteries)**

Tilly. 12 squadrons Dutch and Danish horse advancing in two columns on either side of the road from Oudenarde to Oycke, commanding:

Prince of Orange: 6 squadrons Dutch horse.

Württemberg: 6 squadrons Danish horse.

Week. 4 battalions Dutch foot in a single column on the road. The brigades listed below following on behind.

Wassenaer. 2 battalions Dutch foot guards in a single column on the road.

Woudenberg. 2 battalions Dutch foot and 1 light gun battery in a single column on the road.

Boisset. 2 battalions Danish foot in a single column on the road.

Wurttemberg. 2 battalions Danish foot and 1 light gun battery in a single column on the road.

Godecker. 2 battalions Danish foot in a single column on the road.

Bielke. 2 battalions Dutch foot in a single column on the road.

Grovstein. 2 battalions German foot in a single column on the road.
