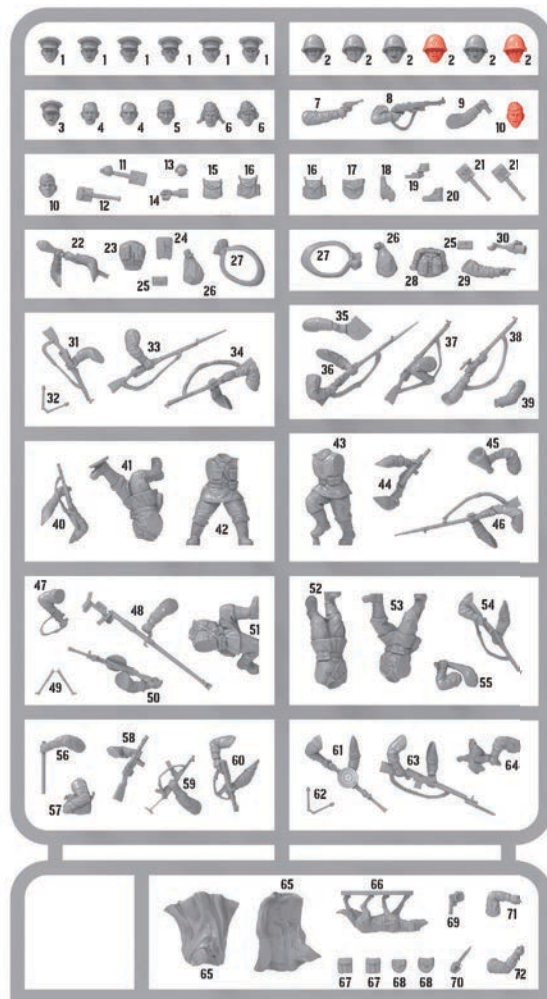

*Soviet forces used submachine guns in huge numbers, appreciating their utility in urban warfare and close-quarter fighting. The PPSH and PPS were designed to be rugged, effective, and incredibly quick and simple to manufacture, and proved popular with their users.*



*The Soviets were some of the most enthusiastic and effective employers of dedicated snipers during World War II, including a surprising number of female sharpshooters. Deadly in urban combat, and lauded by Soviet propaganda, they struck fear into enemy soldiers and hunted high-value targets.*



*The NKVD were the brutal secret police of the Soviet regime. While better known for their mass arrests and executions, many were used as internal troops, guarding rear areas and serving as the infamous 'blocking detachments' to prevent Soviet soldiers from retreating. Some also saw combat at the front, fighting fanatically to win victory at any cost.*



*Cheap, simple, and quick to make, Molotov Cocktails (so named by the Finns during the Winter War against the Soviets) were little more than a glass bottle filled with an incendiary mixture and a rag for a fuse. When thrown, the bottle shattered and the contents ignited, setting the target aflame. Soviet troops used these improvised weapons during the desperate fighting against German Panzers, alongside a wide variety of other ad-hoc equipment.*

*Political officers attached to units in order to maintain morale and adherence to Communist doctrine, Commissars were a crucial part of ensuring the Soviet Army fought with sufficient fervour. Often despised and feared as much by their own troops as the enemy, they were responsible for 'encouraging' men and officers alike to acts of great bravery – sometimes at gunpoint.*
